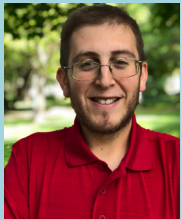

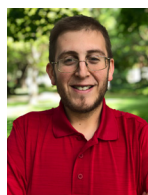

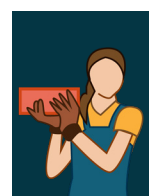

Online Discussions

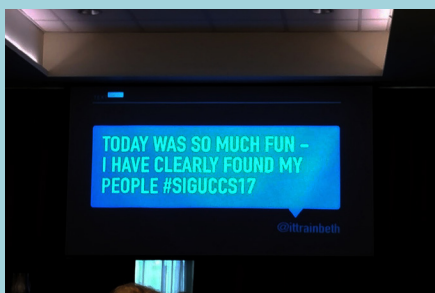

Interpersonal Networking

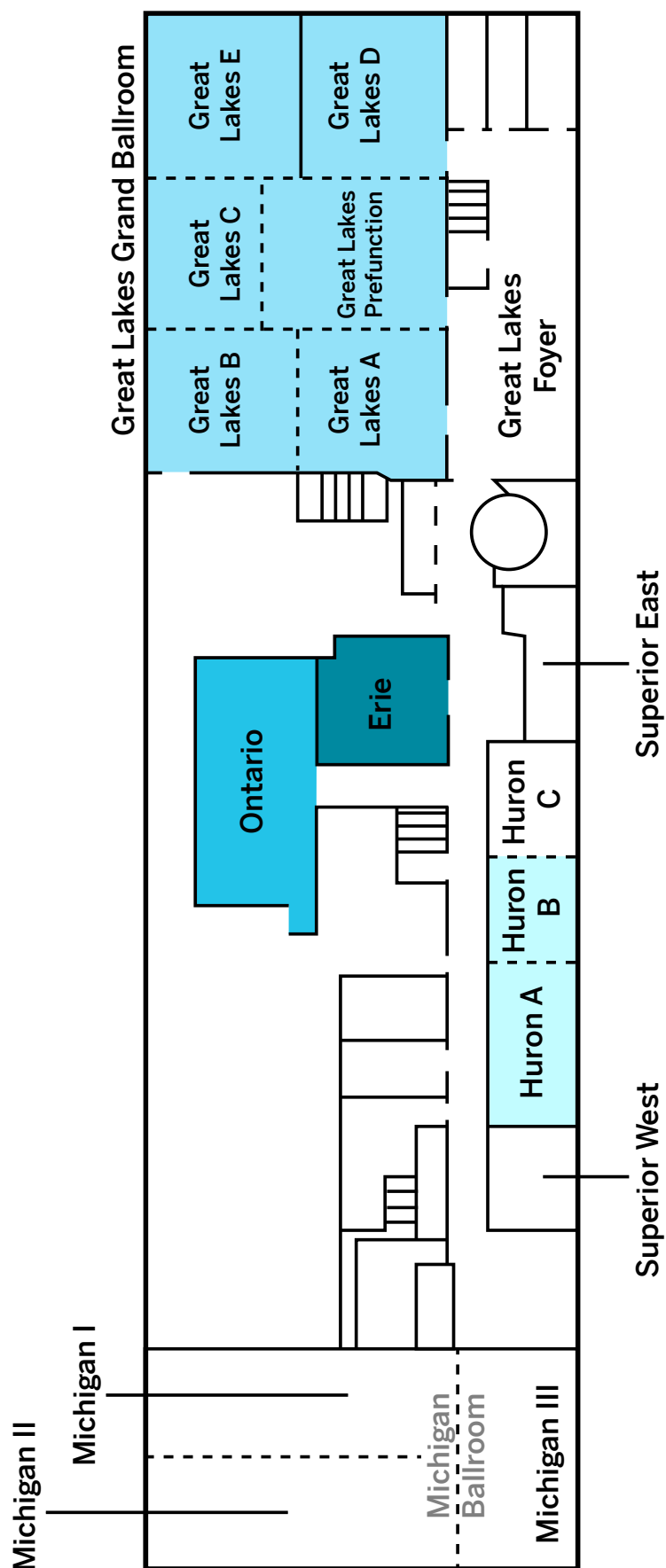
